

**SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL**  
**CONSTRUCTION OF ROAD HUMPS - LITTLE BRISTOL LANE**

**Details of the proposed changes**

NOTICE is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council in exercise of the powers conferred by section 90A of the Highways Act 1980 (hereinafter called 'the Act') and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 90C(1) of the Act and those bodies or persons prescribed by the Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999 (hereinafter called 'the Regulations') and in accordance with section 90C(2) of the Act intends to construct road humps in the form of speed tables at the locations specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

The speed tables will be 6 metres in length and 75 millimetres in maximum height, subject to the tolerances permitted in the Regulations. The speed table specified in Part I of the Schedule will extend over the full width of the carriageway. The speed tables in Part II of the Schedule will terminate 300mm from the edge of the carriageway.
